In the New Testament, Jesus interpreted these *actions* as *attitudes*. He compared *murder* with *anger*, *adultery* with *lust*, *theft* with *covetousness*, *lying* with *deceit*, and *coveting* with *pride* and *selfishness* (Matthew 5); these are the *heart attitudes* from which the *outward sins* come.

It is absolutely certain that, compared to God’s righteous standard of the Law and to the sinless example of Jesus Christ, **all men are sinners!** It is also certain that **no man** can be justified (saved) before God by keeping the Law.

“Therefore by the deeds of the law there shall **no flesh be justified in his sight**: for by the law is the knowledge of sin.”
